What Sets Our Program Apart

Children thrive in an environment that supports their development by creating an environment that is physically safe, socially enriched, emotionally nurturing, and intellectually stimulating. We ensure the high quality of our program by concentrating on the following key areas:

- Low teacher-to-child ratios (1:8 for preschoolers and 1:5 for toddlers)
- Strong curriculum that emphasizes the importance of developing the whole child
- Developmental assessments that help staff identify the individual strengths and needs of each child
- Family involvement that makes parents active partners in their child's growth and development
- Ongoing staff development to ensure that our classroom reflects the latest thinking in the field
- Comprehensive services for children and their families who need extra help to maintain stability

Our staff qualifications exceed state licensing requirements. Teachers are well-educated in Early Childhood Education and Child Development and hold Child Development Permits from the State of California. They have B.A. and M.A. Degrees in Child Development or Education, or are working toward those degrees. All staff hold current child CPR and First Aid certificates. Teachers also attend annual workshops to keep up to date in current research and teaching methods.

Our Philosophy

At St. Joseph Center we believe that children deserve a safe, supportive, and nurturing environment where they develop physically, socially, emotionally, and cognitively. We also believe that playing is learning. Child-initiated and teacher-supported play is an essential component of our program.

Our developmentally-appropriate, creative curriculum incorporates elements of the Reggio Emilia approach. We encourage children to explore and discover through play as well as interactions with peers, adults, and their surroundings. Our diverse and culturally sensitive early childhood classrooms help children develop positive attitudes toward others who are different from themselves and enable children with diverse needs to achieve their full potential.

Dual Immersion classrooms provide both native English and Spanish-speaking children with the chance to become bilingual early in life through play, art, music, and performance. A high quality bilingual environment opens up a new world of possibilities for every child.
